INFORMATION SESSION WITH THE MAYOR, 6:00 P.M.

Regarding paving of the streets and Communications C-76, C-77, and C-78.

The information session opened at 6:00 PM. Mayor, Dean J. Mazzarella began by informing the City Council about the Cities plan for paving. He informed them that FY20 Chapter 90 funds are not yet ready to be spent, but the prospective streets are Granite Street, Highland Ave, Orchard street, Walnut St, Willard Street, Grove Ave. Have alternatives too, such as Smith Street. These streets will be paved in sections. The City is also currently working on unaccepted streets.

Councillor Feckley, asked if fixing the culvert will help King Ave. He informed her that it will be redirected down North Street and would discharge that way.

Regarding C-76, C-77 and C-78, the Mayor reviewed the questions submitted by Councillor Dombrowski. He began with the ordinance regarding vacation buyback. He informed the council that many employees work through vacation due to workload, and would like to reimburse them because of the inability to use their time. John Richard, the Comptroller, also explained that it would help employees who are retiring to be able to buy out their vacation time, which would not count for retirement purposes.

Councillor Chalifoux Zephir asked if it would apply to non-union employees. The Comptroller informed her that it would. She asked what it is now, Mr. Richard informed her that it is currently two weeks buy back.

Councillor Freda asked if this is equitable across the board for everyone. Mr. Richard informed the Council that it would be more equitable this way.

Councillor Dombrowski asked if this was retroactive. Mr. Richard informed him that it was just for this calendar year.

Mr. Richard explained that because they are nonunion salaries there is no negotiation. He explained that we have always put reserves aside in the Collective Bargaining Expense account to use for these raises and bargaining. Councillor Dombrowski reiterated that he understood this as bringing the nonunion employees and the union employees closer to equability.

Councillor Freda asked how long it would take to get retroactive pay. Mr. Richard informed her it depends on the workload of the department that it is coming from.

Councillor Feckley asked who are the specific employees affected by this? Mr. Richard informed them it is City Department Management and Secretaries.

Councillor Bodanza asked about communication C-89. Do not have cameras at stop lights, fields, etc. Would like to add them to the Monoosnock Brook area, the new park on Mechanic Street, these would give a back up for safety in parks.

Councillor Chalifoux Zephir asked when Free Cash would be certified. Mr. Richard informed her that it is in the States hand.
